Dear Ms. Jones;

Enclosed please find one (1) unbound copy of the final report from the cultural resource reconnaissance survey conducted in support of the proposed jurisdictional transfer of the following roadways in Broward County:

- Atlantic Shores Boulevard between Three Island Canal to the east, and a point 37 feet east of N. Federal Highway to the west;
- Rancho Boulevard from 49 feet east of Interstate 441 to 184 feet west of El Rancho. The project area also includes 47 feet of a paved driveway that is north and adjacent to Rancho Boulevard;
- SE 26th Avenue from 46 feet south of E. Hallandale Beach Boulevard to 40 feet north of Diana Drive.

This study was undertaken to ensure that the transfer of control of these parcels will not affect any historic properties that are listed, or determined eligible for listing, in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). No other project improvements or activities are associated with these transfers. For each of the three transfer parcels, a search of the FMSF identified no previously recorded archaeological sites within the archaeological APEs. The search of the FMSF identified no previously recorded historic resources within the historic resources APEs, and the property appraiser data identified no "Actual Year Built" dates prior to 1965.
