Section 9J-5.021 **Consistency of Local Government Comprehensive Plans with the State Comprehensive Plan**, of the Florida Administrative Code states "Each local government comprehensive plan shall be consistent with the State Comprehensive Plan as it appears in Section 187.201. F.S.". Table 11-1 identifies the State Comprehensive Plan goals and policies and corresponding goal, objective and policy statements of Hallandale Beach Comprehensive Plan.
